

**NSCC Implements Greener Printing** – In keeping with the college’s commitment to being “**Green**”, North Shore Community College is introducing a new print management system across its campuses at the start of the Fall 2009 semester. The goal of this initiative is to reduce the amount of unnecessary paper waste in our academic spaces. Beginning Monday, September 14<sup>th</sup>, a pay-for-print policy will be in effect in the libraries, open computer labs and computer classrooms.

#### **Student Free Printing Allotments Each Semester:**

- All registered credit and non-credit students receive \$25.00 of printing credits per semester.
- Upon registering for classes, this money will be automatically deposited into a student's special printing account.
- In the event that a student uses the \$25.00 during a given semester they can, at anytime, immediately add credits to their account through a secure online credit card transaction service (Mastercard/Visa/Discover) <https://nscprint.pcounterwebpay.com/index.cfm>

#### **Adding Credits to Your Account:**

- If you have a campus pipeline username and password – enter that information at the pcounter login screen
- If you do not have a Campus Pipeline username and password select the option “**I do not have an account yet, I would like to create one**”.

#### **Rates:**

- .10 cents per B&W page (single or double sided)
- .25 cents per color page (single sided)

Note: \$3.00 minimum on credit card transactions

#### **How the System Works:**

Each time a print job is sent in within a computer classroom or computer lab a popup window will display the current “balance” and request your Campus Pipeline username and password. After entering your pipeline username and password the print request is fulfilled and your print account is updated automatically.

In the event that students exceed their free page limit and do not have a credit card, they may pay for prints with cash in the libraries on both the Lynn and Danvers Campuses. Cash will not and cannot be accepted in the open computer labs or classrooms.
